Our Lenten appeal is for the **Aberdour Refugee Resettlement and Support Group**. The group is working with the Home Office to offer a place for a refugee family. Last week there was an additional collection for the **Disasters Emergency Committee Ukraine** appeal. You can give to these by placing an envelope in the church box in the Pharmacy.

During the current war in **Ukraine** the church is open after the Sunday Service until 2pm for private prayer.

As you know the Church of Scotland has plans to reduce the number of ministries/buildings. We are awaiting the results from the **Building Audit**. There have been **Cluster/ Area/ Grouping Conversations** with Dalgety, Inverkeithing, North Queensferry and Rosyth churches. The discussions have been positive and it is proposed that there will be a team ministry with a single Kirk Session. The plan will be approved before the end of the year. This could give exciting opportunities but the transition will need to be undertaken with sensitivity and care. There will still be a worshipping congregation in each of the five areas.

It is good to see the church hall being used once again, there are plans for a **Christian Aid Coffee Morning** on 28<sup>th</sup> May.
