Dear Friends,

It has been a long haul, but the end is in sight. As you will see from elsewhere in the Magazine, plans are now well advanced for the long-awaited renovation of the Church Hall. The money for it has come in a bit more slowly than hoped for, but it has come in and the generosity of the people of the village is much appreciated. The initial appeal was launched in September 1992, and in the three years since then £45,000 has been raised -

a splendid effort.

There are however, parishes in Scotland where it is quite impossible to raise funds for much needed new projects simply because the money isn't there. These are areas where various issues such as long-term unemployment, a high number of single-parent families, elderly people living alone, poor housing, isolation and lack of community facilities combine to have an adverse effect on the lives of individuals and on the life of the community as a whole. To help the situation in such areas, and with the full backing of this year's General Assembly, congregations throughout Scotland are being encouraged to participate in the "Priority Areas Appeal" with the aim of setting up a Fund which would support church and community projects in Scotland's most disadvantaged urban and rural parishes. The Church aims to raise around £12 million from this special one-off Appeal. The Kirk Session decided that the best way to make a contribution to this Fund would be through the retiring offerings at the October communion services, with an appeal to members to give, if possible, a little more than they normally · would. Priority Areas are often defined by negatives. But the words and actions of ordinary people within the community together strive to bear witness to a loving Christ who cares. If you are not at communion but would still like to make a donation, put it in an envelope marked "Priority Areas Appeal" and put it in the offering bag any Sunday. 

CHURCH HALL APPEAL

The Church Hall Appeal Fund currently stands at just under £45,000 against a budget cost for the renovation work of £55,000 including VAT. It is plannned to bridge this gap through application for local authority and Church of Scotland grant aid, interest accrued on money raised to date, and further fund raising. FURTHER DONATIONS WILL BE MOST WELCOME.

Plans for the work are substantially complete now and planning permission has been applied for. The first costs in this stage of the programme have been incurred, this being £500 in respect of fees for planning consent and building control approval. The work will include demolition of the existing kitchen and toilet adjacent to the small hall, a new porch entrance to the small hall, general refurbishment of the main hall, the provision of a new kitchen and improved storage for hall users under the St. Colme Hall, and an upgrading of the west entrance to make it more welcoming (foot of spiral staircase). The small hall, rear meeting room and St. Colme Hall will also be renovated to give enhanced comfort levels and redecoration. If funds allow, a suspended ceiling will be installed in the main hall. A copy of the plan is included with the magazine. The outline timetable for progressing the work is as follows:

October 1995 . . Tenders issued to contractors November 1995 . Tenders evaluated and Presbytery approval sought December 1995 . . Contract accepted Mid-January 1996 WORK STARTS
